CORNER



In the past, a large emphasis has been placed on teaching literacy concepts such as letter identification, sound recognition and phonological awareness in Early Childhood classrooms to set up children for success in Kindergarten and beyond. However, recent research suggests that mastering mathematical skills may actually be more critical to student success longer term.

In our play-based environments, children are provided with materials that encourage them to count, measure, compare quantities, make patterns, record data, sort objects, add/subtract, and practice shape recognition. Teachers also incorporate music and movement. Activities to promote development of these skills through auditory listening and kinesthetic movement. In addition, high quality children's literature is also utilized to introduce and reenforce mathematical language and vocabulary.

Adding Math into Your Child's Day

1. Look for familiar numbers on signs as you drive to school, take a walk through your neighborhood or shop at the grocery store.

2. Invite your child to cook or bake with you. Measuring, scooping and pouring are not only fantastic fine motor activities, but they are also wonderful ways to introduce concepts such as comparing quantities. Cooking together is also a great way to introduce new vocabulary and encourage them to follow multi-step directions.

3. Ask for their help preparing the table at meal times. Counting out the appropriate number of plates, utensils, napkins, etc. is perfect to practice counting and 1-to-1 correspondence.

4. Count, count, and re-count! Choose toys that are already of interest to your child and encourage them to count as they play. You can also help them count at snack or meal times, using foods such as cereal, crackers, pieces of fruit, etc.

5. Build together using Legos or blocks. These manipulatives can be used to count, compare sizes and introduce concepts of measurement.

ST. PETE SPOTLIGHT


